This is 'Some Tunes 2', our second compilation CD.

The first 'Some Tunes' was released mid 2006 and contained tracks of the young dutch bands: Aux Raus, Elle Bandita, 3-1, Melomanics and Nobody Beats the Drum. Now we all know that most of them had some good years and lots of success in Holland and abroad so we at Basserk have the feeling that we made a damn good selection back then. But.. that was then, this is now, so here is the new one! On this CD are some old Basserkers and quite a few new ones.

Again it's a Diamond in the rough, a 16 carat diamond with 16 killer tracks!

3-1 has been with Basserk since the day we started so of course they are on Some Tunes 2. This time with a remix they've done for the Moi non Plus. It's also a bit of a appetizer for the remix album of 3-1 that will be released in a month or two.

The new bands/producers are: **Lazy Late Kids** (two young French blokes that open the CD with a loud and pumping track), **Gtronic** (a young Belgium artist that has been playing on some Basserk parties already and knows how to rock the dance floor), **Quick & Brite** (Dutch duo that has been playing for quite some years now), **Fantastadon** (American boy with a nice bouncy track), **Capacocha** (Dutch RocknRoll/Electro talent, you'll be hearing loads more from this guy in the future, the new electro Iggy Pop) **Plemo & Rampue** (cheeky, cheesy but nice German sing along song, watch out cause this one stays in your head), **Monkey Maer** (French duo with punky background, Vive la France!), **Vince The Prince** (Dutch guy also know as Vincent Koreman), **Bronstibock** (Strange dutch duo high on acid, techno and electro).

Yes, a very varied compilation CD again with some old and some new faces but most important: lots of great tracks. Enjoy it, and don't forget 'Diamonds are forever'
